**Message from the Administrator....**

Our Lady Queen of Peace is a great parish with a vast amount of opportunities for every member of the family to participate in throughout the year. We are inviting you to be a registered parishioner, and to join one or more of the many ministries and organizations here at the parish.

Since arriving in July, as a parish we have tried to make a good parish even better.

Through your generosity of time and talent, nearly 200 new sign-ups for ministries/organizations took place.

Addressing the concerns of the loss of families over the last five years, nearly 2/3 of the parishioners in attendance voted to make a slight alteration to the Mass schedule which has resulted in an increased Mass attendance.

To address the many issues facing the parish from finances to capitol needs, we established Advisory, Master Plan, Plant Management, and Liturgy Committees. The views and thoughts of the parishioners are now being voiced and advice rendered in decisions.

There have been many things that needed to be addressed upon my arrival. We had a flood in the basement of our rectory office that caused significant damage, and we have had on going issues with other capitol needs. Frankly, with over \$550,000 in debt in July, and little reserves, items needed to be addressed, but we lacked significant monies. Through cost cutting, and the generosity of the people of the parish we have addressed some items. I would like to take the opportunity to recognize some of those people, professionals, and businesses that provided services at little or no personal profit.
