FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MICHAEL SAINTS CHAPEL AND SAINTS DOORS TO BE BLESSED

At the 12 noon Mass, we will have the official blessing of the Saints Peter and Paul doors in the front of the Church, and the new Saints Chapel. This is truly a great day for our parish! Why?

First, we honor the Saints. The Saints are people like us, who served God in an exemplary way, and do only His Will. The saints are intercessors for each of us. The saints are the worthy souls that give us courage and hope, that we can model our lives following after them.

Secondly, the doors and Saints Chapel are a testament to the goodness of the people of God, and the exemplary gifts that people have offered to **Enhance God's Home**. Through the kind generosity of parishioners who donated to the EGH campaign, the vision as planned four years ago has come in part to a reality. We now have a prayer room, a place for solitude and private meditation. A place to seek out the goodness of God in quiet is a gift of peace. By virtue of the closing of the side entrance, we have secured this quiet place for one to pray. We now also have a place in the rear Annex called the Gathering Space that will soon be the place to gather. We are planning hospitality in the coming months after Sunday Mass, which will increase comradery among the parish community.

Third, a majority of the items to be blessed this weekend have been given new life through this parish enhancement which is the first in many years. The Saints Peter and Paul doors come from a Church that was closed in Scranton. Three statues in the Saints Chapel come from closed Churches in western Pennsylvania, and Ohio. Two statues (Fatima and Jude) are from the Gathering Space and are now highlighted in the room. Theresa is from the annex, and Philomena is new, as well as Mother Theresa which will be added this spring.

My dear friends in Christ, join me in celebrating faith, prayer, the Saints, and our parish.

FROM ASHES TO EASTER

This Wednesday, as we begin the season of Lent; ashes will be placed on our foreheads symbolizing our willingness to follow Jesus more closely and to be of service to one another. The Lenten Opening Prayer reads: "Grant, O Lord, that we may begin with holy fasting this campaign of Christian service, so that, as we take up battle against spiritual evils, we may be armed with weapons of self-restraint."

How are we to spend these Lenten days in preparation for Easter? Jesus, in the Gospel for Ash Wednesday, gives us a road map to follow. He suggests three things that will help us during this season of grace: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. They're like a tripod of Jewish spirituality. These meant a lot to the Jewish people and they were very dear to the heart of Jesus.

Prayer. I don't have to remind you that we all live busy lives and frequently our prayer life is forgotten, and put off to one side. This is the time to get back on track again. One of the best times to pray is in the morning as a new day begins. Is it possible to find five or ten minutes of quiet time alone with the Lord? We ask his blessing on the new day that is about to unfold. We thank Him for a new day of life, and we ask His blessing on the decisions we have to make and all the people we will meet during the day. The highest form of prayer is the celebration of the Eucharist. If your schedule permits, this would be a wonderful opportunity to begin the day by attending Mass, listening to the Scriptures and receiving the Lord in Communion. I offer you the opportunity to check out the Lenten schedule listed in today's bulletin.

Fasting. The first thing we think of is fasting from food. And we certainly can do that. When we fast we are reminded of how fortunate we are to have easy access to food, while at the same time conscious of those who struggle to survive. Of course we can fast from things other than food. We can fast from impatience and anger and laziness. We can fast from spending too much time on the smart phone, computer or watching TV. From what am I being called to fast at this time? What will really be sacrificial that will cause me to think and ponder about God in place of the item that I'm fasting from.

Almsgiving. Lent is a time to consider the many blessings we have. The question is: how do we share our gifts with others? I recommend putting out a rice bowl, and each day put any loose change in it to help the needy.

Simply, Prayer, fasting and almsgiving will help us on our journey. If at the end of Lent we can say that we are more like Christ, and have grown in the spiritual relationship through these Lenten practices, then we will truly have a gift of a deeper relationship with Christ, and we can celebrate the great joy of Easter.


