FROM THE DESK OF MARY BETH WELCOMING NEW MEMBERS



The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process through which adults who have not completed the Easter Sacraments (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) prepare their minds and hearts to be open to the Spirit that comes to them anew with great power in these Sacraments. It is an initiation into a faith family – the community – in this case into the Parish Family of Our Lady Queen of Peace. It is a time of learning about our faith and discerning how God is inviting them to become an active part of our family of faith.

I want to thank the team members who have been studying with our candidate this year: Pat Callahan, Patricia Daly, Amanda Anderson, and Dot Novak. Besides talking about what makes us Catholic and the Christian Way of Life, lots of time is spent on how we are called to live and share our faith. The commandments and the beatitudes are discussed and most important is an intense look at the Sacraments, especially the Easter Sacraments, the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This year our candidate is preparing to be confirmed. Let me introduce our candidate Kristin Tedesco. She shares her story.

“My RCIA journey began when I was asked to be godmother to my cousin's son Michael McAllister. Thanks to the group I have been meeting with weekly, I have been given the inspiration to develop a better understanding of my faith and to become a more engaged Catholic. I am grateful to have gone through the RCIA process at this stage of my life because I believe it has given me the opportunity to refresh my understanding of our Catholic values, and given me the tools that I will need to be a guide for my godson as he begins his journey.”

This Sunday at the 10:30 Mass we will celebrate the Rite of the Call to Continuing Conversion with Kristin and gift her with a Bible. Let us join in prayer for her during this Lenten Season as she makes her final preparation to receive the Gift of the Holy Spirit in Confirmation at the Easter Vigil.

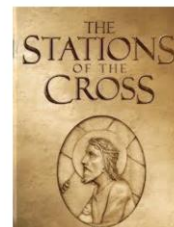
