FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MICHAEL FINDING SELF IN THE MIDST OF THE COLD

This past Wednesday morning was probably the most stark, and coldest moments since I have been in the parish. The Highlander Academy was closed as well as the Day Care, and the Office was not opening till 1 PM. No one was around, not even the plows that were so busy during the storm on Tuesday. Just nothing, no people, or wildlife, and it was cold and barren, no activities. It was like the parish was closed and located in the arctic. This was certainly eerie, and It was a reminder that life sometimes at its base is nothing without God. Yes, no human or animal, but God was present. It was like walking in the desert (mind you 70 or 80 degrees cooler), but not alone, and in fact trying to seek someone.

I think that we all have had this same experience, but the question is how did we handle it? Did we seek God? Did we use the opportunity to find someone? Did we recognize our-self in the midst of the abyss?

Ultimately, we need these experiences to realize God in our lives, how important people are among us, and yes that wildlife does cheer us up. It also should inspire us to seek God and make Him a priority. We should desire a relationship with God and never desire to be alone. We should desire the Heavenly gates, and not the emptiness that the devil promises. If anything, this past week should serve as a reminder that even in the midst of the cold loneliness, that God is there and that we are called to a relationship with Him.

By finding our self, and reawakening the soul, we will find that relationship to be more fruitful with God.

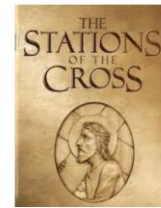
